Bigger equipment is customarily utilized outdoors to clear areas and grade land in preparation for construction.

There are various projects which require the expertise of a heavy equipment operator, including public works projects and endeavors of privately owned businesses. Jobs completed by public works offices can comprise road construction and the building of bridges. There are many other publicly funded projects that consist of dam construction, airport runways, power plants, municipal structures and levees. Private projects could consist of the construction of office buildings, malls, retail stores and industrial parks.

A few of the smaller scale tasks require machines made of the use in big industrial spaces or inside commercial buildings. Typically, the machinery selection comprises pallet jacks, forklifts and cherry pickers. Trenchers and backhoes are normally available in various sizes appropriate for tasks needing less bulky and powerful equipment.

Normally, a heavy equipment operator is needed to be certified by local or regional agencies. Some are cross-trained and certified to operate a lot of different machine kinds. Others choose to specialize in operating only one type of equipment and only require periodic updates on their operating permit certifications.
