Some heavy machines which does certain tasks includes wreckers, crane operators, drivers excavator operators and telehandler operators. A CDL or commercial driver's license is among the basic qualification needs for obtaining such jobs. A CDL could be acquired via our heavy equipment training programs.

A crane operator for example will need to undergo an in-depth training course which include various certification programs before being able to operate an overhead crane. Several heavy equipment truck drivers on the other hand could only require some other site specific training in addition to their CDL. The in-depth training that follows certain machine is needed since a lot of the work occurs in hazardous scenarios and dangerous scenes so the operator should be able to ensure a safe working surroundings all the time. The safety training is vital as well as the communications training which helps the group on the ground be able to always communicate with the operator.

Heavy equipment machinery normally work in extreme environments and are put under great strain regularly. Hence, there are many heavy equipment jobs available in repair and maintenance. Heavy machine operators are highly trained workers who are able to repair, diagnose and troubleshoot heavy machines on site or in a workshop. Mechanics have to be ready to transport their tools to a job site and carry out repair and maintenance in different conditions.

It could be possible for delivery drivers to acquire work with only a CDL, even if for several jobs, certain endorsements may be necessary. Like for example, delivering large pieces of machines or components that are exceptionally large for construction projects would require the driver to complete further training to handle and haul huge loads. Normally, the drivers operate with chaperone vehicles that are driven by trained drivers. These chaperone vehicles typically escort the delivery truck to its destination.
